

Maryland's general election is **November 5, 2024**, but you may be able to vote earlier depending on how you choose to cast your ballot. There are three ways to vote, so use this checklist to make a plan. If you need assistance registering or finding a polling place, visit [vote.md.gov/Vote2024](https://vote.md.gov/Vote2024).



## REGISTRATION

You must be registered to vote to participate in the general election. Unlike the primary election, you don't have to be registered with a specific party. You can register to vote until November 5, 2024 (election day).

If you're planning to register the same day you vote, be sure to bring a document that proves where you live. Any one of these examples can be used to prove your address:

- Your MVA-issued license
- ID card
- Change of address card
- Your paycheck
- A bank statement
- A utility bill
- Any government document with your name and address
