



Maryland's general election is November 5, 2024, but you may be able to vote earlier depending on how you choose to cast your ballot. There are three ways to vote, so use this checklist to make a plan. If you need assistance registering or finding a polling place, visit vote.md.gov/Vote2024.



## **REGISTRATION**

You must be registered to vote to participate in the general election. Unlike the primary election, you don't have to be registered with a specific party. You can register to vote until November 5, 2024 (election day).

If you're planning to register the same day you vote, be sure to bring a document that proves where you live. Any one of these examples can be used to prove your address:

- Your MVA-issued license
- ID card
- Change of address card
- Your paycheck
- A bank statement
- A utility bill
- Any government document with your name and address

## **VOTING**

You can vote from October 24 to October 31 at early voting centers in your county. Polls are open from 7 am to 8 pm. If you're in line by 8 pm, you'll be able to vote.
